Description <i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>On 13 November 2024 and 29 April 2025, two online strategic meetings brought together managers of confiscated assets to create a space for dialogue with the Italian authorities. 175 people attended the meetings, the majority being Italian, but simultaneous translation allowed participation from representatives of several European countries and Nigeria.</p> <p>The first meeting focused on three main themes: the social, economic, cultural, and political impact of experiences in the reuse of confiscated assets; the role of public-private networks and alliances in these initiatives; and political responsibility in the management of these assets. The importance of the European network and advocacy for the implementation of the European Directive 2024/1260 on the social reuse of confiscated assets has been emphasized. The discussions highlighted the importance of creating alliances, transforming public assets into common goods, supporting social cooperatives, measuring the social impact of initiatives, and strengthening relationships with institutions to promote social cohesion and prevent organized crime.</p> <p>The second meeting allowed institutions and third-sector organizations to become familiar with the new Unified Platform of the National Agency for Seized and Confiscated Assets (ANBSC). This platform facilitates transparency, project submission, and the free allocation of assets to associations for social projects in various areas: social, health, employment, culture, safety, and legality. Allocation procedures, evaluation criteria, and the possibility of integrated projects were detailed, enabling greater efficiency and enhanced social impact.</p> <p>These meetings laid the groundwork for the Manifesto on the public and social reuse of confiscated assets and the National Forum held in Rome on 14 November 2025, aimed at showcasing social reuse experiences, strengthening networks, and promoting social cohesion and innovation in local communities.</p>
